If you are looking to give spey casting a try, choose one of these. Whether for Steelhead/Heavy Trout nymphing or traditional spey casting, a 6 or 7-weight spey rod is your ideal choice.

All ACR Spey and Switch rods come with an ACR Steel-Head or SST fly line in matching size.

5-Weight Rods

- 1255-4** 12' 5" A sweet, light, responsive 5-weight spey rod that will bring out the best of a half-pounder while having the power to handle any summer-run on the Rogue! \$700
- 1525-5** 15' 2" 5-weight five-piece. Finally a light trout spey made just for the full line guy or gal. This rod excels at extreme line control. \$750

6-Weight Rods

- 1266-4 Explorer** 12'6" 6-weight four-piece. A rod that is comfortable on most Summer Steelhead water south of Canada. This Explorer Series rod comes with the appropriate floating line! \$450
- 1296-4** 12'9" 6-weight four-piece. A medium-fast action, smooth casting 6-weight that is perfect with Scandinavian style heads. Al Perryman's favorite Rogue River stick! \$750
- 1386-5** 13'8" 6-weight five-piece. A moderate/fast action rod. This rod can do it all. \$750

7-Weight Rods

- 1297-4** 12'9" 7-weight four-piece. The lightest 7-weight on the market! Throwing 425 grains, this rod shines in underhand casting. Well represented on the Rogue and Deschutes. This rod works! \$750
- 1237-5** 12' 3" 7-weight five-piece. A classic Scandinavian style Spey rod. This rod casts darts with a 435 gr ACR Steel-Head & a short stroke. \$750
