Two things need to happen to have a balanced outfit—the right weight line, and the correct style of line. **Anderson Custom Rods** can provide the guidance and instruction to setting up your two-hand outfit. At **Anderson Custom Rods** we believe in the versatility and fishability of a shooting head line system for spey rods. All **ACR** spey rods will also cast short and mid-spey lines, but our line and weight designations are based on shooting head lines.

Finally! This is a smooth casting Skagit head, not just a piece of fat level line. The SST has a short, powerful front taper that will turn over a heavy tip and large fly. In sizes from switch/trout spey up to 8-weight spey. Available in all sizes April 1st.

ACR’s “Steel-Head” is a Scandinavian style floating shooting head line for use with **ACR** spey and switch rods.

Steel-Heads are 31 to 40 feet long and combine maximum distance casting with a controlled turnover resulting in a perfect compliment to any spey rod—especially an **ACR!**

Steel-Heads come in six sizes from 280 grains to 580 grains, and can be custom cut to meet any fishing/casting situation.

Steel-Head lines are a light green color with a short back taper and a 15 to 19 foot front taper depending on size. Steel-Heads can be used with nylon or poly leaders.

Steel-Heads are the perfect line choice for all summer and early fall steelhead fishing throughout the Northwest. Steel-Heads offer the finest delivery system for all surface and near surface fishing techniques. By adding a sinking poly leader to the tip of the Steel-Head, swinging flies in the mid-water column is easy.
